

**San Diego School Performance Fact Sheet: MASSAGE Programs
(Spring 2012-Fall 2012) (updated 2/8/12)**

Completion rates: BHS –no students in the cohorts required to track for ACCSC Fall 2011 Annual Report; AS – new program/no graduates by time of Fall 2011 ACCSC annual report; AAS 0%; MTH/AB 29%*

•The completion rate is calculated by dividing the number of graduates by the number of students available for graduation.

Placement rate: BHS –no students in the cohorts required to track for ACCSC Fall 2011 Annual Report; AS – new program/no graduates by time of Fall ACCSC annual report; AAS 0% (no students to track for placement track for ACCSC Fall 2011 Annual Report; MTH/AB 50%**

•The job placement rate is calculated by dividing the number of graduates employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

•The student may obtain a list of the employment positions determined to be within the field for which a student received education and training for the calculation of job placement rates from the Director of Alumni Services.

License examination passage rates: There is currently no licensure exam required to get licensed as a Massage Therapist in California.

The college makes no claims to applicants regarding salary that may be earned after completing the program. However the 2010 median annual salary listed for the EDD Labor Market Division category for “Massage Therapist” in California is \$37,107.***

(AS enrollee) The AS program was new as of the Winter 2011 term. Therefore, the number of students who graduate, the number of students who are placed, or the starting salary you can earn after finishing the educational program are unknown at this time.
