Board Certification

Upon completion, you will be eligible to use the holistic MSN coursework to sit for the appropriate holistic nurse, advanced holistic nurse, or nurse coach board certification exams offered through the American Holistic Nurses Credentialing Corporation (AHNCC), as long as you meet all the other application eligibility criteria. The prerequisite for entering the MSN program is a bachelor's degree in nursing (BSN).

- Associate degree in nursing (or higher) from an accredited institution recognized by the US Department of Education or international equivalent
- Active, unencumbered Registered Nurse license in state or jurisdiction where the student's clinical experience in CL 520ce will occur
- English language proficiency

RN-TO-BSN

- RN license
- GPA of 2.75 or higher
- · English language proficiency

MSN

- BSN from an accredited nursing program (regionally accredited and CCNE, ACEN, or NLN accredited)
- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
- English language proficiency



PRACTICAL INFORMATION

BS IN NURSING

- Cumulative GPA ≥ 2.75
- High school or college-level Biology with Lab with a grade of B- or higher*
- High school or college-level Chemistry with a grade of B- or higher*
- Written essay (A personal statement describing motivation for entering the field of nursing)
- Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) with scores at or greater than the current national average on each of the four (reading, math, science, English and language usage) sections
- Background check
- Drug screen (screen includes tetrahydrocannabinol [THC], a substance in marijuana)
- · Vaccine record indicating:
 - 2 doses of live measles vaccine (serological evidence of immunity can substitute)
 - ii. 1 does of live mumps vaccine (serological evidence of immunity can substitute)
 - iii. 1 dose of live rubella vaccine (serological evidence of immunity can substitute)
 - iv. At least 1 dose of meningococcal ACWY vaccine within the last 5 years or a complete 2- or 3-dose series of MenB; or A signed form indicating that the student will obtain meningococcal vaccine within 30 days

*An applicant may be admitted to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing program (pre-licensure option) who does not meet this requirement as long as they agree to take BIO101 Introduction to Biology and/or CHEM101 Introduction to Chemistry (depending on which requirement(s) was not met) as electives in the program during their first semester of coursework. These courses will be counted as a science electives and be used to fill 6 credit hours of the elective requirement of the program. These cannot replace the humanities elective requirements. Other courses for which the student has the appropriate pre-requisite courses may be taken during the first semester with these courses. However, in this special case of not meeting the admission requirements related to these two courses, these courses become prerequisites to WS110, WS110L, WS210, WS210L, WS315, and WS315L. Students must earn a B- or higher in these courses (like other science courses in the general education portion of the curriculum). Failure to achieve the B- will result in the same actions in terms of progression, probation, and disqualification as other general education courses requiring a B-

SCHEDULE AND COURSE DELIVERY

The didactic classes are offered online, using a combination of live classes and asynchronous coursework with defined outcomes. Live classes are delivered in real time, with audio and video connection to faculty and fellow students. They are recorded in case you have to miss them.

The clinical portion of the BS in Nursing program option is on-campus, at PCHS' beautiful lower Manhattan facility in New York.

Each program includes mandatory clinical practica. All practica are done in the student's locale. Faculty and staff support the process of each student

finding their own preceptor.

We work hard to create a safe teaching/ learning environment and strengthen important collegial relationships.

The connection among students is comparable to that of on-site classes with the added benefit of attending from the comfort and convenience of your home.

A full-time student can complete the certificate program in as few as two semesters, the RN-to-BSN in four, the BS in Nursing in five, and the MSN in seven.


