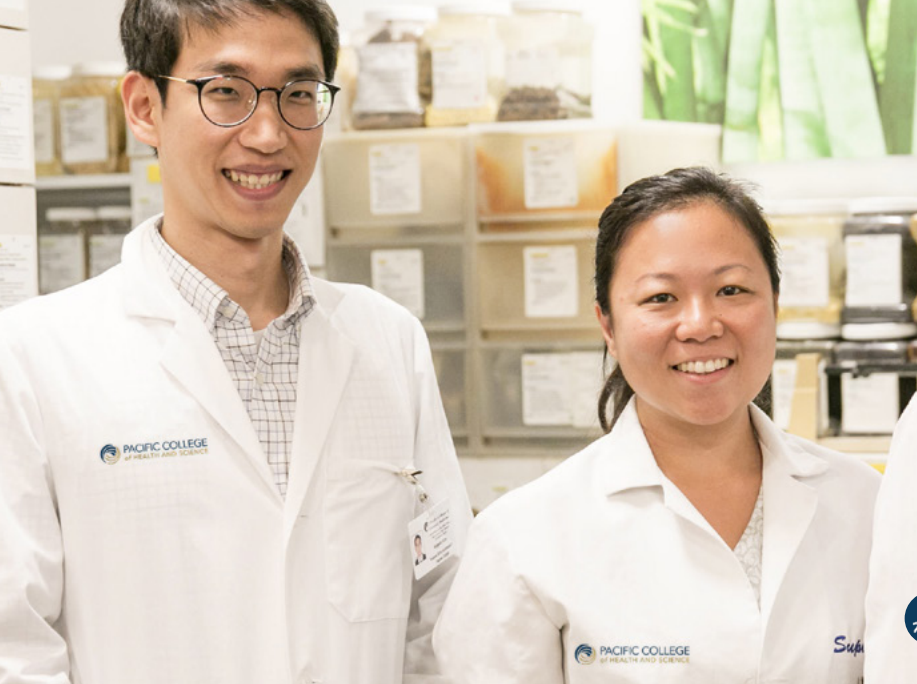

Chinese medicine is one of the oldest continuous systems of medicine in history, with recorded instances dating as far back as 2,500 years. However, the origin and development of the profession of Chinese medicine in the United States has only truly occurred in the last few decades, with Pacific College one of its biggest champions since 1986!

More recently, acupuncture and other similar East Asian modalities such as herbology or tui na bodywork have increasingly gained in popularity. In fact, they have evolved into **one of the most utilized forms of complementary integrative medicine interventions in the United States**. According to the National Institute of Health (NIH), more than 10 million acupuncture treatments are administered annually in the United States alone. This rise in popularity can be attributed in part to its documented effectiveness for pain relief, nausea, allergies, and other chronic and acute conditions, and in part to the fact that scientific studies have begun to prove its efficacy.

This goal has been largely achieved as reflected in the adoption of licensure laws in virtually all states, the recognition of holistic healthcare as a viable modality in the U.S., and the growing number of third-party payers that offer insurance coverage for Chinese and East Asian medicine treatments. **The National Institutes of Health recognize the usefulness of acupuncture in treating addiction, fibromyalgia, headaches, cramps, back pain, osteoarthritis, carpal tunnel, asthma and much more.**

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

START DATES:

- Winter: January
- Spring: May
- Fall: September

PREREQUISITES:

- Master Programs: Bachelor's degree, associate degree, or 60 college credits, 15 of which must be general education.
- Doctorate Programs: Minimum of 90 college credits, 15 of which must be in general education.
- Advanced Programs: Active acupuncture license.
- 2.75 undergraduate GPA

CO-REQUISITES (DOCTORATE PROGRAMS ONLY):

General psychology, general biology, and general chemistry (these courses can count toward the 90-unit prerequisite, and the general education requirements)

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS:

- Completed [application](#)
- \$50 application fee
- 1-2 page essay detailing interest and motivation to complete the program
- Official transcripts from all colleges previously attended
- Final interview with member of Admissions Committee

PROGRAM LENGTH:

- 9-11 terms for full-time students
- Part-time schedule also available

TUITION & FEES:

- Varies by program and campus, as well as the number of credits transferred.
- Financial aid and other financing options available for those who qualify.
