PRACTICAL INFORMATION



BS IN NURSING

- Admissions decisions will be based on a holistic review of each student including a comprehensive review of the candidate's academic performance and entrance exam test scores.
- Cumulative GPA ≥ 2.75
 - High school GPA must be used if applicant has ≤12 college credits. Applicants who have completed the GED (5th series, 2014 - present)¹ in lieu of a traditional high school diploma and who have earned ≤12 college credit hours must meet or exceed a minimum score of 175 on each section of the GED exam.
 - ii. College GPA must be used if ≥ 13 college credits have been awarded
 - All official transcripts from all accredited (regional or national) post-secondary institutions (e.g. colleges, community colleges, universities, etc.) attended must be submitted and used in the calculation of a college GPA
 - No earned grades will be omitted from the calculation of the cumulative GPA. An earned grade will be used in the cumulative GPA calculation even if it is not eligible for transfer. For example, a grade of C in College Mathematics cannot be transferred, but that C grade will be used in the cumulative GPA calculation for admission purposes.
- Written essay: a personal statement describing motivation for entering the field of nursing. The essay should be typed, double-spaced, and approximately 1 to 2 pages in length.
- Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS)
 - i. Minimum composite score of 68
 - ii. Applicants are allowed a maximum of three attempts to take the TEAS exam within a six-month period, with mandatory remediation between each attempt
 - iii. TEAS scores must be obtained within a year (365 days) of admission application
 - iv. Failure to meet the composite score minimum benchmark or exceeding the maximum number of attempts will render the applicant ineligible for admission to the nursing program
 - v. Applicants to the January 2025 start (and future terms) must complete TEAS testing on-site at Pacific's New York City campus





BS IN NURSING

- Background check: results must allow a student to participate in clinical at every contracted agency per PCHS and agency agreement).2
- Drug screen (screen includes tetrahydrocannabinol [THC], a substance in marijuana)
- · Vaccine record indicating:
 - 2 doses of live measles vaccine (serological evidence of immunity can substitute)
 - ii. 1 dose of live mumps vaccine (serological evidence of immunity can substitute)
 - iii. 1 dose of live rubella vaccine (serological evidence of immunity can substitute)
 - iv. At least 1 dose of meningococcal ACWY vaccine within the last 5 years or a complete 2- or 3-dose series of MenB; or a signed form indicating that the student will obtain meningococcal vaccine within 30 days

Note that applicants academically dismissed from another nursing program are not eligible for admission to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (pre-licensure option) program. Academic dismissal is not customarily noted on an official transcript, so dismissal is inferred based on common nursing academic dismissal policies which in general are 2 or 3 course grades at C or below in nursing courses. While students with evidence of an academic dismissal from a nursing program will be denied admission, the applicant can appeal the decision to the dean of nursing.

1: 4th series (2002-2013): minimum score of 500 on each section of the exam. 3rd series (1988-2001): minimum score of 50 on each section of the exam.

2: PCHS is not responsible for determining the effect of any prior criminal history on an applicant's/ student's ability to be licensed as an RN in any US state or jurisdiction. For information related to criminal history and RN licensure, contact the state board of nursing where licensure is desired.
