Graduates with a Master’s in Acupuncture or equivalent will earn the **Doctorate in Acupuncture (DAc)** and those who have also studied herbs will earn a **Doctorate of Acupuncture and Chinese Medicine (DACM*)**.

**Effective January 1 2022, Pacific College will follow ACAOM’s revised nomenclature and replace the “DACM” degree title with “Doctor of Acupuncture (DAc) with a Chinese herbal medicine specialization”*
